Steven "Steve" Luther Parks, age 69, of Hobart, passed away Wednesday, May 22, 2019, at 9:40 am, surrounded by his family, after a two-year battle with lung cancer and end stage COPD. He was born in Hammond, Indiana on March 17, 1950. Steve graduated from Horace Mann High School, class of 1968. He served in the 82nd Airborne Division in the Army and survived Vietnam after jumping out of perfectly good airplanes. After coming home, Steve became a member of the International Brotherhood of Teamsters Local 142 in Gary, Indiana, where he retired as a business agent in June of 2011 after 39 years in the brotherhood. He was an avid hunter and fisherman. Steve was a Chevrolet classic car and truck restorer because on a quiet night you can hear a Ford rust.
