Bronko Marinkovich went home to be with his Lord and Savior on April 10, 2025, at the age of 75. Born on January 25, 1950, in Lippstadt, Germany, Bronko's life was a testament to courage, love, and adventure. As a young child, he immigrated with his family to the United States through Ellis Island, a journey that marked the beginning of an extraordinary American life.

He was raised in Gary, Indiana, and graduated from Horace Mann High School. Following his education, Bronko served his country honorably as a Military Police Officer in the United States Army during the Vietnam War. His dedication to service was a reflection of his steadfast character and patriotism. After returning home, Bronko pursued higher education and earned an engineering degree from Ivy Tech. His career as a service engineer allowed him to travel the globe, visiting Mexico, Europe, South America, Asia, and nearly every corner of the United States. their loyal Westies. The open road, ever-changing scenery, and peacefulness of nature brought him great joy and contentment.

Bronko is survived by his loving wife of 26 years, Mary H. Marinkovich; his devoted children, Nathan (Ginger) Marinkovich and their children Niko and Ava, and Joann Marinkovich, along with her beloved dogs Buddy and Jax. He also leaves behind his stepchildren Jeff (Angela) Boyd (Heather, Andrew, Chandler, Alan); Edward (Nadine) Boyd (Zachary, Erin, Ethan); and Dawn (Keith) Hartsell (Alyana, Xander, Justin, Stephen, Michael, Chaz).
