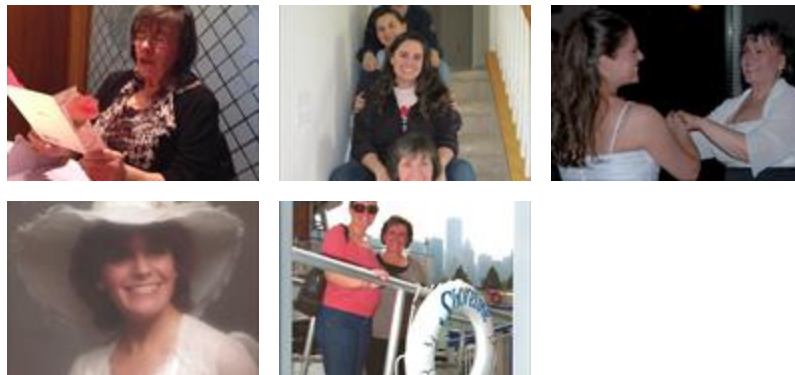



“ I want to offer condolences to your family at this time of your heartache. Know that as time dulls the edge of your sorrow, your memories of her will sharpen, letting laughter back in.


