Cedomir Radovich age 93 of Valparaiso passed away on Saturday June 8, 2013. He was a loving husband, father, and grandfather and will always be remembered for the wonderful care he provided for his family. He is survived by his loving wife of 67 years, Milica; sons Robert (Barbara) Radovich of Chesterton and Milan (Constance) Radovich of Valparaiso; grandsons Michael Radovich and Robert Radovich Jr. of Chesterton; granddaughter Jessica (Jason) Gusic of Chesterton; cousin Lilian (Miron) Papadakis of Elmhurst, IL; sister-in-law Madeline of England; sister-in-law Anka and nephews Budimir, Nenad, and Chaslav of California; and many relatives living mainly in Montenegro and throughout the rest of the territory of the former Yugoslavia. Preceded in death by his loving daughter Zagorka Zorine; parents Bozidar and Slavka Radovich; brothers Blazo Radovic, George Radovic, Budimir Radovic, and Boro Radovic.

Cedo was born in Podgorica in Montenegro in the former Yugoslavia. He served as a fighter pilot in the Yugoslav Royal Air Force with the rank of lieutenant. During World War II he served as an encoder in the headquarters of the Chetnik guerilla unit leader General Draza Mihajlovic. Cedo arrived in the United States in 1950 with his wife and two of his children, eventually settling down in 1951 in Gary, IN where he worked and retired from U. S. Steel at Gary Works. He was a member of St. Sava Serbian Orthodox Church

having served in the past as Recording Secretary. He also was past president of the Serbian-American Republican Club of NW Indiana; of Udruzenje Serb Boraca Draza Mihajlovic of America; the Serbian Cultural Historian Club "Njegos" in Gary and Merrillville; and he was a supporting member of the Karageorge Choir.

Funeral services will be held at 11 AM directly, Thursday June 13, 2013 at St. Sava Serbian Orthodox Church, 9191 Mississippi St., Merrillville with V. Rev. Marko Martic officiating. Internment, Calumet Park Cemetery. Visitation will be Wednesday June 12, 2013 from 4PM to 8 PM at the Burns Funeral Home, 10101 Broadway, Crown Point from with a Pomen Service at 7:00 pm.
