Charles C. MacDonald, age 95 of Crown Point, passed away in St. Anthony Home on 11/7/2009. He was a graduate of Horace Mann High School, class of 1931. He attended Northwestern University for two years. Chuck graduated from Purdue University with a B. S. in Mechanical Engineering, and was a member of Sigma Nu Fraternity. He received his M.B.A. from the University of Chicago in 1951. He retired as President of Wisconsin Steel Division, International Harvester (Navistar) in 1987.

Chuck was on the Board of Directors of Calumet Area Industrial Development Commission and the Northwest Indiana Boys & Girls Club. He is an Honorary Life Trustee for the Glenwood School for Boys and Girls. He was a member of the Assn. of Iron and Steel Engineers (AISE), the Metallurgical Society of Mining, the Metallurgical and Petroleum Engineers (AIME), and the Chicago Assn. of Commerce and Industry, and he was active in Junior Achievement, and the Executive Program Club - University of Chicago.
