“ Our condolences to the Balash family. Many people in Hobart know Gene through his towing business. I always called him when I needed help with a tow. He was an honest guy, willing to help rescue people when their vehicles broke down at all hours. But I also remember when Gene was another kind of hero. He rescued people from a fire in an upstairs apartment in downtown Hobart back in the 1980s, when I was editor of the Hobart Gazette. He was driving, I believe in his tow truck after a call, along Main Street late one night, when he saw smoke in the air. He pulled over to investigate and saw it was pouring from a building in the 300 block with upstairs apartments. Despite the personal risk, he didn't wait for the fire department. He acted. He ran into the building, hustled up the stairwell and banged on doors, notifying the unknowing residents their building was on fire and helped them get out. I don't recall how many people he rescued that night, but I think it was several. Matthew 25:21
