May 20, 1919 - March 4, 2012

Edward Carl Nelson age 92 of Hobart, passed away March 4 2012. Ed was born May 20, 1919, to Owen and Caroline (nee Sapper) Nelson on a farm near Hobart, IN. He was a lifelong member of Trinity Lutheran Church in Hobart where he taught Sunday School, was an Elder and Deacon for over 60 years and a member of the Calumet Lutheran Dart Ball Hall of Fame. He graduated from Merrillville High School in 1937. Ed was drafted into the Army October 22, 1941, captured in North Africa and was a prisoner of war in Germany for 27 months. When he returned, he married Grace Buchfuehrer on July 28, 1945. He retired from Indiana Bell Telephone with 39 years of service and was a member of VFW Post 5365 and a local group of former P.O.W.s. Ed loved his family, gardening, golf and travelling and, in his younger years, playing soft ball.
