



George "Biff" "Woody" Woodward

August 7, 1944 - December 29, 2024

Retired U.S. Army Lt. Col. George B. Woodward died peacefully at his home on December 29, 2024.

George was born on August 7, 1944, to Frank and Sally Woodward. He graduated from Edison High School in 1962, and from Indiana University with a Bachelor of Science Degree, on June 12, 1967.

A veteran of the United States Army, he served from November 1968 through June 1994.

Lt. Col. Woodward is a Veteran of the Vietnam War. He served in the Army Special Forces as a Green Beret and was awarded the Bronze Star for meritorious service.

Lt. Col Woodward's friendship with his brothers-in-arms spanned decades. Forged from trust and reliance on one another, he firmly considered those brothers his first family as no greater bond exists than that forged in trust and in protecting each other's life during battle.
