June 22, 1951 - May 19, 2020

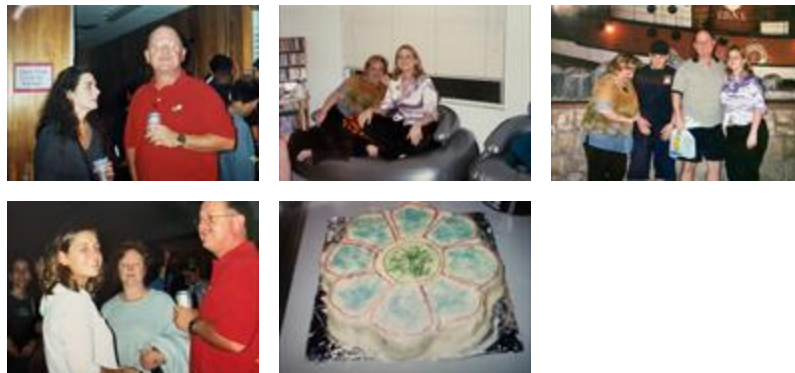

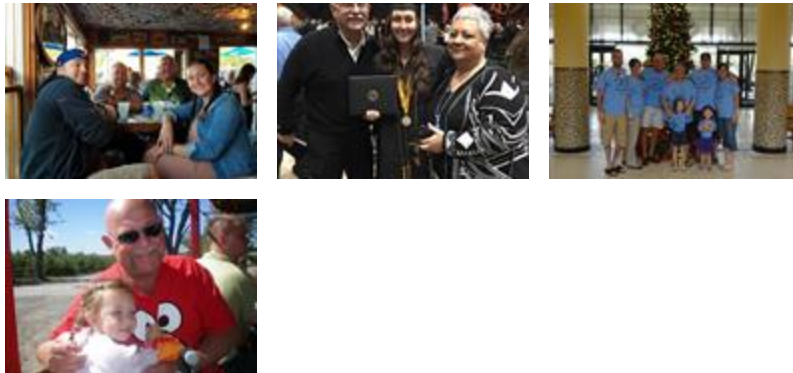

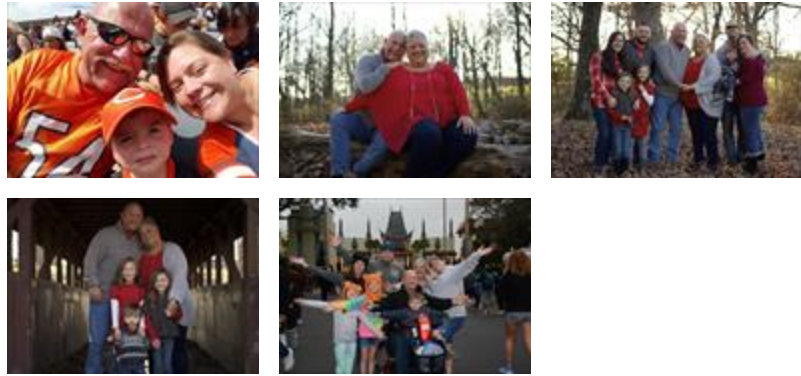
