Jeffrey Langfels, age 63, of Crown Point, IN, passed away on December 21, 2024. He was born on October 31, 1961, to Robert and Rose Langfels in Peoria, Illinois.

Jeffrey attended Spalding Academy in Peoria, Illinois and St. Louis University's Parks College. He continued on to join the U.S. Air Force as an airplane mechanic and radar operator. Jeffrey was stationed in places such as the Philippines, Honduras, and New Mexico.

Jeffrey held many roles throughout his life. He had his own business fixing computers, worked to put Wi-Fi on airplanes, and at the end of his career he returned to the passion that started it all, airplane mechanics. Jeffrey retired in 2023 and spent his last year of life traveling around the United States experimenting with his drones.

He had an incredibly strong faith and belief in God. Jeffrey spent much of his time learning about his Catholic faith and sharing it with others.
