“ I started at Sun Engineering in 1987, three years after Kirk. After about 6 months of running machines, I became a supervisor, working along with Kirk. His background as a millwright and mine as a machinist often gave us opportunities to discuss the different ways to approach a problem.

Before Kirk left to seek treatment, we would often end the workday in either one of our respective offices to discuss the day or just talk for fun.

I found that we both have roots in Casey and Martinsville, IL. Kirk shared many stories of his trips to Casey for pitching classes for his children.

One of the things I appreciated about Kirk was his constant reminder to not worry about it so much and it will not play out. That was not always easy for me.

The last day we spent together he came to my office, where we spent 2 hours talking about retirement, Medicare, cars, phones...but nothing about the shop. And we talked about the pride he had in his children's success.

In many ways, Kirk's leave in February helped prepare me and Sun Engineering to move forward, while still being able to reach out to him. I would often send him pictures of the projects we were completing.

I will miss his counsel. I like to think I earned his respect. He will be thought of often.
