



Lois Kathryn Harvey

October 13, 1933 - January 25, 2020

Lois W. Harvey, 86, of Crown Point, IN passed away on January 25, 2020. Lois had been married to her husband, Samuel, for 62 years and was a resident of Crown Point, IN at the time of her passing.

Lois Kathryn Watson was born on October 13, 1933 in Aleppo, PA, a daughter of James Stiles and Nettie Grace Watson. There were nine children in her family and she grew up on a farm in a large two-story house that her father built. The family attended Windy Gap Church in Aleppo, Greene County, PA. Lois had four older brothers – Ford, Leon, John, Jennings (Jennings was known as “Jenk”) and three older sisters – Beulah, Elizabeth, and Margaret (Margaret was known as “Peg”) and a younger sister, Janet. Her siblings called her “Kitty” and that nickname evolved into her husband, Sam calling her “Kitten.” She met her future husband, Samuel J. Harvey, at Center Twp. High School.

Mrs. Harvey graduated from Center Twp. High School, Rogersville, PA in 1951 and the Indiana University of Pennsylvania (formerly known as Indiana State Teacher’s College) in Indiana, PA. in 1955. She was a teacher at Jefferson-Morgan High School, Jefferson, PA and Cardington-Lincoln Schools, Cardington, OH.

On June 22, 1957, she married Samuel Johnson Harvey. Lois and Samuel

moved to Cardington, OH when he accepted a teaching position. Lois began working at the Cardington-Lincoln Elementary School system as a substitute teacher and then became a reading teacher. Over the years, Lois was very active in many church, school, community, social, and educational organizations. She and her husband moved to Crown Point, IN in 2012 in order to live closer to their son and his family. Lois was a member of Bethel Church in Crown Point.

Her husband, Samuel Harvey of Crown Point survives as well as her son: David S. (Brenda) Harvey of Crown Point, grandchildren: Alyssa M. Harvey, Emily R. Harvey, and Kyle D. Harvey as well as a sister, Elizabeth Minear of Brenham, TX, along with several nieces and nephews. Deceased, in addition to her parents, are brothers: Ford, Leon, John, and Jennings and sisters: Beulah, Margaret, and Janet.

Visitation at 10am followed by a Memorial Service at 11:30am will be held on February 8, 2020 at Bethel Church - Crown Point, IN with Pastor Gary Butler officiating. A graveside ceremony will be held in the future at Rosemont Cemetary in Rogersville, PA.
