“ I am so sorry to hear about your mother's passing and sorry that I cannot say this in person. I met your mother through my work as an Ombudsman. We were chatting and she told me that she was from a place I'd never heard of, Dychsburg, Kentucky. I told her that I had heard of it and had even been there; it's where my father was born. Your mother knew his family and told me about my grandparents and my father's older brother and sister, who she knew from school. She was so charming and interesting that I went back to see her a few times. I found some pictures of the Dychsburg of her youth online and showed them to her and she seemed to take delight in showing some staff and other residents the pictures of her father's post office and a local store owned by the father of "my first boyfriend".

Talking with her was so intriguing that my wife and I decided to make a side trip on our next visit to Paducah. Your mother said she would go there with her mother on the ferry but the Interstate got us there much faster. Your mother's recollections helped me find my grandparents' home and it was easy to find the post office, both the old one of her father and the new one. We went to the cemetery and found the graves for both of our families. I took a lot of pictures and, when we got back, I printed them and made one more trip to see Mrs. Brasher. I brought along a few souvenirs/gifts of Paducah and the pictures, which I left with her, and I thanked her for inspiring me to make the trip that proved to be so profoundly moving.

I have remembered her so often since meeting her and I am so grateful for having met her. I hope she saw how delighted I was to have known her.
