Mary Lillian (Doolin) Kennedy, age 86 of Crown Point, IN passed away on Wednesday, September 2, 2020 with loving family by her side. Mary is survived by her husband of 65 years, John J. Once the years of household president, chief cook and bottle washer were behind her, she went to work for many years as a bookkeeper. But to Mary, her most important job and greatest joy was that of Mother, Grandmother and Great Grandmother. Her family was her life, it was her sacred calling and the true essence of who she was. She will be missed by all who knew her beautiful smile, her kind and gentle heart, and her hugs.... she gave the best hugs! To quote a beautiful old movie, we certainly believe she's "earned her wings". So onward and upward she goes as she takes her final journey to her Heavenly Father, where she will find his warm embrace and peaceful rest.
