



Ruth A Thompson

September 5, 1918 - October 30, 2013

Ruth A. Thompson, age 95 of Hobart, passed away on October 30, 2013. She was a well known Northwest Indiana violinist with the Northwest Indiana Symphony (57 years), the LaPorte Symphony and the Southwest Symphony. Ruth provided music for many musicals over the years. She was a retired music teacher from the Gary School System. After raising 6 children she returned to school (I.U.) and received her bachelors degree in Music Education. Ruth received her Masters from Northwestern. She served as a string coach and chaperone for the American Youth Symphony in 1968 and 1969. She met and married her late husband, Murl Thompson, at Bradley University in Peoria, where she grew up. She organized the Thompson String Quartet which provided music for many local events. Ruth was a member of the First United Methodist Church of Hobart where she was very involved with the music program.

She was preceded in death by her husband, Murl and brother Joseph Glenn Klecker. Ruth is survived by her children – Judy B. Thompson-Hall of Hobart, James L. (Charlet) Thompson of Richland Hills, TX, David M. (Ginny) Thompson of The Villages, FL, Donna R. (Jack) Woods of Federal Way, WA; Glenn A. Thompson of Sacramento, CA, Susan (Paul) Miller of Hebron; 15 grandchildren, 2 step-grandchildren; 14 great-grandchildren; niece – Sherrill Petri of Peoria, IL and nephew – Steven Klecker of IA.
