Susan Claire (Campbell) Wallace, beloved mother, grandmother, sister, and friend, passed away peacefully on Thursday, July 10th, 2025, in Hobart, Indiana after a long and courageous battle with glioblastoma. She was 73 years old.

Sue was born on August 24, 1951, in Gary, Indiana to Dolores Antoinette Lahaie Campbell. She was preceded in death by her mother and brothers, Bill and David Campbell.

She is survived by her sister, Kathy Lake, and her sisters-in-law, Gloria Koscho, Letty Kasch and Karen Gonzalez. She leaves behind her three sons—Bryan Wallace (Patricia), Blake Wallace (Becca), and Josh Wallace (Melissa) as well as her twelve grandchildren: Madeline, Lillian, Griffin, Ava, Gabrielle, Violet, Spencer, Jackson (Mallie), Savannah (Garrett), Sawyer, Brooklyn, and Everett Wallace. Sue was also anticipating the arrival of her first great-grandchild this coming September.

Sue dedicated her life to raising her sons; spending her days tending to her house and taking care of her three boys, always making sure they had what they needed. Her Catholic faith was an important part of her life and her sense of purpose.

A gifted artist and a loyal friend, Sue had a remarkable ability to connect with people. She didn't know a stranger—her openness made everyone feel at

home. She took great joy in knowing each of her grandchildren individually—what sports and activities filled their time, and what made them unique. Being able to attend events that featured her grandchildren, especially in the last year and a half of her life, was Sue’s favorite thing to do. Sue always remembered her grandchildren’s favorites, just as she had done for her sons growing up. And as many know, her love for coffee was unmatched—a small daily pleasure she treasured.

Sue’s memorial service has been delayed, allowing family and friends time to gather in her honor. Services will be held on Saturday, October 18th, 2025, at Burns Funeral Home & Crematory located at: 701 E. 7th Street Hobart, Indiana 46342. Visitation with family and friends will take place from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m., with a memorial service to follow from 12:00 p.m. to 1:00 p.m.

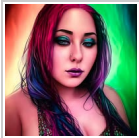
