THOMAS P. CAMPBELL, age 65 of Hobart, passed away on Monday, September 15, 2008. He was raised on the West Side of Gary and was a graduate of Bishop Noll High School, Class of 1960 and Indiana University. He taught at Emerson High School in Gary and retired from the Lake Station Community Schools where he served as Guidance Counselor. Tom also coached high school baseball and basketball. He was a member of the Hobart Kiwanis, Hobart Lions Club (past president), a 3rd Degree member of the Knights of Columbus, St. Thomas Council #1347 and Phi Delta Kappa International Educational Fraternity. Tom was a former Hobart Precinct Committeeman and City Councilman and past member of the Plan Commission and Board of Zoning Appeals in Hobart.
