



## Ugo Arrighi

March 28, 1931 - October 23, 2024

Ugo Arrighi, age 93, of Crown Point, IN, went home to be with his Lord and Savior on October 23, 2024. He was born on March 28, 1931 in East Chicago, IN to Mario and Narcisa (Valentini) Arrighi.

Ugo was a jack of all trades; he could do anything. He was a self-taught accordion player and mastered the button box accordion. He also played the harmonica, was a master plumber and woodworker, and a well-loved real estate apartment complex owner. Ugo owned 12 units in Whiting, and later bought Crown Point North Apartment Complex owning over 50 units. Ugo was the bar manager at their family restaurant, Spiccias in Whiting for many years.

He was a United States Navy Veteran who served during the Korean War. Being a Yeoman on his ship, doing most of the ship's office/ administrative work. Ugo was a member of the Italian Sons and Daughters of America Villa Cesare Lodge 27 in Crown Point, the Crown Point American Legion, a long-time member of St. Joseph in Hammond and later attended St. Matthias Catholic Church in Crown Point.
