William C. "Bill/Maddog" Bodnar, age 68, of Hobart, IN passed away on July 26, 2017. He was born in Gary, IN and was a long time resident of Hobart. Bill was a 1967 graduate of Hobart High School and received his Bachelor of Arts degree from IU-Bloomington and his Master of Liberal Arts from Valparaiso University. He retired from Portage High School, where for 38 years he devoted his life to fighting ignorance and illiteracy and directing the plays and musicals. Bill also served as an adjunct professor of theatre and communications for 20 years at Indiana University Northwest. His stage experience included more than 150 productions as an actor or director. Bill was an avid golfer, Bears fan, and never missed the show Jeopardy. He is survived by his wife of 44 years-Laura; two daughters-Megan and Samantha; his mother-Elizabeth; one brother-Jerome; two sisters-Patty (Jon) Ford, Peggy Bodnar (Michael Miller); numerous aunts, uncles, cousins, nieces and nephews.

Funeral services for Bill will be held Monday, July 31, 2017, beginning with prayers at 9:15 a.m. from Burns Funeral Home, 701 East 7th Street, Hobart, going to St. Bridget Catholic Church for a Mass of Christian Burial at 10:00 a.m., Rev. Bill was my 12th grade Drama teacher and a wonderful neighbor to my grandparents for many years. I'll always remember how incredible he was at getting his students to engage with him about whatever was on the agenda for the day.


One of my favorite memories of Bill was at the end the quarter when all the grades were in. The entire class consisted of him telling a riddle he called "The Name of the Game." "The name of the game is letters and patterns, not words and ideas." He must have said that nearly 100 times along with dozens of other clues to reveal what the name of the game was. "The name of the game is a spoon, but it's not a fork." "The name of the game is tall, but it's not high." "The name of the game is a pretty, but it's not beautiful." He somehow made this puzzle interesting, fun and madding for the entire class. Soon, one by one students began to understand and started presenting the riddle to the rest of those who didn't get it. "The name of the game is a puppy, but it's not a dog." There must have been nearly thirty kids in the class, and every one of us was either thrilled and feeling quite superior for having figured it, or going nuts for not understanding yet. In all my years of school, I've never witnessed an entire class so locked in and excited to accomplish something. Bill was able to do that with something as simple as a riddle. He was amazing.

These are the folks who know that God knows. We carry them in our hearts forever. "Hey Bodnar, Not for public consumption on FB, just to share with you. It began by volunteering at a senior community, going room-to-room singing and playing for patients with limited mobility. After putting a proposal together and calling it "Music on the Move", they began to pay me. Subsequently, they asked me to follow this hour with a group session, also paying me. Next, they asked me to play for Mother's Day - had to get an amp and use a mic. Now, they ask me to play every other Saturday, and some Happy Hours. Then, they asked me to play in the Alzheimer's Unit (beginning in August). I put the guitar and my voice down for 40 years, and recently picked it up, first to play for my Hopi friend's grandfather at a care center just to be there. It feels so good to play tunes they know, as I decided to develop a few sing-a-longs. Last time I brought shakers and a big seed pod from Ghana. I share stories about the music, like "The Lion Sleeps Tonight" was written in the 1930's in Africa about a village chief who crossed over and watches the village from the other side of the veil. Amazing Grace was written by a slave trader. I talk of grandparents and how certain songs are to honor them, and how all love songs can be sung about the Creator. Anyway, Bodnar, I keep this on the down low. I call all of this "Music with b." Simple songs - guitar and vocal. Just wanted to share this with the guy who had the PHS Variety Show, where I played. Also, Mr. Peyton let me play with a mic in the school gym. I am reaching way back, some 40+ years to excavate a lost love. Thanks, Bodnar for the initial boost in this direction. . . XO b."

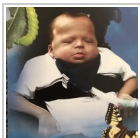
